The Paymaster's report was read for FY 2024-2025. Ed. A motion to accept the Paymaster's Report pending further review was made by Russ Vermillion (1196). The motion was seconded by Larry Heard (1196). Hearing no discussion, the motion passes as read, pending financial review.

Chartering of our New Georgia at Large Detachment 1498. National Sr Vice Commandant Russ Miller presented the charter for Det 1498, Georgia at Large. After which, he conducted the **Installation of Officers' Ceremony** per the ritual.

Commandant spoke to the Department about the new Georgia at Large Detachment (1498) and that it was a long road to get to where we are today. Currently, 1498 has 109 members.

Commandant Delk (1498) asked the Jr Vice Commandant if we had any new members for the initiation. Jr Vice Commandant Coleman responded Yes, sir, we do have one, Pamela Thomas, Associate Member. Commandant Delk told the Sgt-at-Arms to bring the applicant, Pamela Thomas, to the front. Commandant Delk conducted the Obligation of the Marine Corps League. The applicant, Pamela Thomas took the Oath of Membership into Det 1498, as per the ritual.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS:

Judge Advocate: Marty Habecker advised the Detachments that he had sent out emails requesting the Bylaws of each Detachment. Less than half of the Detachments responded. He asked all Detachments to go back and work on their Bylaws in order, vote on them, get them signed, and turn them in.

Commandant Delk stated that we had one person resign with prejudice this quarter. He did so instead of facing Chapter 9.

Junior Vice Commandant: Alton Coleman filled in the Department, stating that he has already held a Jr. Vice Commandant's Zoom Meeting. He said we will have another meeting soon on QR Codes. How and where to use QR Codes. Alton stated that QR codes can be placed on floats during a parade to grab spectators' attention and hopefully draw some new members. He congratulated all Detachments on an outstanding job of getting new members. He stated that if anyone needs assistance, he is here for them.

Senior Vice Commandant: Lisa Delk started by talking about all the work that has happened this past year. She spoke about how the Department has been changing, growing, and learning. Lisa talked about technology and how Detachments can use it to strengthen and build their Detachment. Lisa reiterated that the Department has been pushing communication to make sure the Detachments know we are here for them, and that if they need anything, you should reach out to the Department, that is what they are there for, to help and assist.

She spoke about the help that was provided during the storm damage from their donations. Lisa stated that due to the increase in communication, we have had an increase in the participation in the Department's Quarterly Meetings, and Detachments that have never been, are now

attending.

Lisa stated that at the Commandant's Council, 15 of the 23 Detachments were in attendance. At the convention, we had 18 of the 23 in attendance, and we appreciated all the participation.

She went on to say that you should be aware now that we have a new Detachment, 1498, the Georgia At Large Detachment, and how we started talking about this a year ago, and now it has come to fruition. The idea came out of several Detachments that closed due to one reason or another. The members of those Detachments were moved into the Georgia Devil Dogs, Det. 952, which was not a viable Detachment. Lisa stated that this was done because we did not want to pass our problems to National and that our department would take care of its own. She went on to say that we did not have the prerequisite of having 20 members. With the help of the National Vice Commandant (Jerry Holt), we were able to get it done with just three signatures. It went all the way up to National, and the Charter was approved on 12 March 2025. The EIN and Corporate Registration were completed on 4 April 2025. With the Installation of Officers today, they now have 110 paid members, giving Georgia an additional 98 votes at the next National Convention. The Bylaws are being written now, which will empower the Department of Georgia Officers and the elected and appointed Officers to serve for this Detachment. The annual meeting will be held during the Department of Georgia's convention. The new Detachment will be eligible for PLM distribution in the next year.

Lisa reported that the Department of Georgia is being noticed, and Georgia Pack was chosen to test the new KMA app. The app is an amazing tool, as a Dog Robber, Lisa can go and check on her members instantly. She can do an ROI and other documents online and submit them in 10 minutes, and we were honored to be chosen for the Beta Testing site. This year, the Department of Georgia is Beta Testing the new online payment system. Georgia Pach is now able to submit their transmittal, dues online through the KMA. Jim Breen is the Deputy Kennel Bits and Bites Dog, and the creator of the KMA, is doing something very similar for the League side of the house, and again, Georgia will be the Beta Testing Site. She ended by saying that with the Detachments' support, Georgia and the Southeast Division are leading the way.

Commandant: Commandant Rex Delk spoke about how the Department is going electronically, and after a few hems and haws, everyone is now onboard with the new online system. The new electronic systems allow us to do online transmittals, payments through the Portal, and now 990s and SOS Registrations are coming through the Portal. After the Convention, all documents that need to be filed with the Department or National will now come through the Electronic Payment Portal. This is all being done to have all documents come through one location, streamline the process for Detachments, and become more efficient, and all the documents will be maintained on the server for future reference.

Rex spoke on how two years ago, the Department approved the use of Microsoft OneDrive. All documents are stored on this drive and are accessible to the Commandant. He can reference Detachment files in one location. Rex suggested that each Detachment start using OneDrive to

store all Detachment Documents. This will give the Detachment Officers the same ability and will help maintain continuity from year to year. He talked about having a class on the OneDrive and how to set it up and utilize it.

Report of Appointed Officers:

Chaplain: Mickey Edwards is in the hospital. The report of Deaths this year was read, and the bell tolled for each member.

Newsletter: Brent Eaton stated that the Quarterly Newsletter has been emailed out and posted to the website. He mentioned that if anyone would like to join him with the newsletter, they should contact him.

Web Sergeant: Ed Gizara stated that he knows many Detachments have had a difficult time electronically, and he is there for assistance at any time. He advised all Detachments to use ACH as a payment method, not credit Cards. ACH is only \$0.25, three times less than a stamp. Ed advised all members to look at the website and if they notice anything that needs changes or have a suggestion, contact him, and he will make the changes quickly.

Fallen Marine: No Report

VSO: Ronnie Griffin, our brand-new VSO. Ronnie talked about how bureaucratic the VA System is and how hard it is to maneuver through. He stated that he wanted to do something for our department. He has completed all the training and is available to assist any member and their families, not just Marine Veterans, but all Veterans. He reiterated to the members that if they know any Veteran with a problem, from assistance to losing their place to live, becoming homeless, they should contact him by phone or email.

Disaster Relief: Larry Heard – Nothing at this time.

Young Marines: Jim Berres stated that there are 6 units in Georgia, with the possibility of two more units coming online. Young Marines at the National level have changed everything to online. Jim told the Department that Albany Young Marines has been chosen at the Adult Leadership Conference as the number one Young Marines in the Nation.

In Georgia, Young Marines has over 6,000 community service hours. These Young Marines are involved with the League, the American Legion and the VFW. They do encampments, leadership schools, and more. Jim wanted to thank the Detachments for sending them money. Everything takes funds. He stated that they just had an encampment, and for a unit it costs \$3,500.00

Jim stated that in Georgia, Young Marines have NRA Instructors and Range Safety Officers. The kids love being at the Range and receive support from the Sheriff's Office. During encampments, the Sheriff's Office brings out the dog teams, and they go into the woods and conduct tracking missions with the Dogs. Jim stated that the Young Marines are the Color Guard for the Banquet that evening. This will be an all-female Color Guard.

Jim stated that the Department of Georgia and a Motorcycle Club are hosting a Poker Run for

Young Marines on May 17th. Georgia has an official Young Marines Training Officer.

Rex mentioned that the Metro Atlanta Commanders were awarded the DVA (Distinguished Volunteer Award) for exceptional service to our Young Marines, an equivalent to the Marine of the Year Award.

Sgt-At-Arms: No report currently.

Boy Scout Coordinator: Rex Delk advised that our Boy Scout Coordinator, Mickey Edwards, will be out for an extended period, and he has appointed Larry Heard as the Scout Coordinator. If any Detachment Coordinators need anything to contact Larry Heard. Rex added that the Scout Coins will be moved to Larry Heard.

Youth Physical Fitness Coordinator: Commandant Delk stated that Greg Fisher is our new Youth Physical Fitness Coordinator. He was not in attendance, no report.

Historian: Terry Holland had no report.

Compliance Officer: Lisa Delk stated that the Department of Georgia is 100% compliant, except for the new Detachment 1498, which needs to turn in its Bylaws. Lisa stated that if you do not have Bylaws or your Bylaws have not been approved by the Department of Georgia, please get those turned in; without them, you are not compliant, which affects your PLM Distribution, the strength of the Detachment, and the strength of the Department.

Note: Commandant Delk has the Paymaster bring up the PLM Distribution Spreadsheet. Currently, 4 Detachments (1303, 1311, 1438, 665) units are not compliant and are not receiving their PLM Distribution. These units should submit a voided check to the Paymaster, who submits this information to National (Bob Borka). The Department left a total of \$730.08 on the table.

REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Bylaws Committee: Marty Habecker – No Report

Finance/Budget Committee: Lisa Delk thanked the Finance Committee for their hard work. The Finance Committee submitted a proposed budget with an increase of \$2 for Department dues. Ashford Todd made a motion to increase the Department Dues from \$2 to \$3. The motion was seconded by Ed Gizara. Discussion: Tony Gasper (647) suggested that we increase the Department dues by \$5 and designate a portion for Young Marines. Lisa stated that she didn't disagree with that, but we need to take small steps. She reminded everyone that the Department is doing fundraisers for Young Marines, like the Poker Run, which will be an annual event. Rex suggested a compromise on the motion by increasing the dues by \$1, which would be designated for Young Marines. Ashford Todd (783) amended his motion that the Department will increase its dues by \$3, \$1 of which is designated to Young Marines. This amended motion was seconded by Larry Heard (1196). Discussion: Marshall Tuck (564) suggested a line item be entered into the Budget for Young Marines. Lisa agreed that a line item be added to the budget so that \$1 of each member's dues would be designated in the Budget for Young Marines. Rex stated that he could not support an increase of \$10, but could support an additional \$1 increase. He also mentioned that donations are being accepted and can be designated for Young Marines. Barbara Brammer suggested that each Detachment donate \$100 to Young Marines. Ashford Todd (783) amended the original motion to go from an increase of \$2 to \$3 with the designation that \$1 go to Young Marines. The motion was brought to a vote. A unanimous vote approves the motion. Lisa asked for a motion to accept the budget as proposed. Tony Gasper (783) and Larry Heard (1196) seconded the motion. Discussion: The proposed budget was corrected to show a dues increase of \$3 per member, \$1 going to Young Marines. The motion passed unanimously.

Tony Gasper (783) asked Johnny Baker to challenge each Detachment to donate \$100 to the Young Marines of Georgia. Johnny Baker challenged each Detachment in the Department to donate at least \$100 to the Young Marines of Georgia.

Convention Committee: Rex asked all Detachment 1402 members to stand and thanked them and their commandant, Terry Holland, for their hard work and outstanding job in hosting this year's convention.

Youth Physical Fitness Coordinator:

Commandant Delk advised that Detachment 783 has someone interested in taking this position.

Commandant Delk had the Sgt at Arms put us in recess for 15 minutes at 0950.

The Sgt at Arms brought us back into session at 1005.

Alton Coleman (783) stated that Detachment 783 would be donating \$200 to Young Marines.

Young Marines had an Adult Leadership Conference in Dallas, Texas. Getzie Lamar gave a short presentation at the conference

Ed Gizara spoke on the Poker Run for Young Marines, at each of the 5 stops they got a card. At the end, whoever has the best hand wins. There will be 3 prizes for the 3 best hands. There will be a BBQ afterwards for the riders and participants and this will be an Annual Event going forward. Signing up is online now.

Rex Delk asked how many people have received an email asking them to get him a gift card. It's a scam, he stated if it does not have his card signature, it's a scam. There are many different email scams out there and to be extremely careful. If it does not look or feel right, stop and call the official number to the entity from their official website.

Mid-Winter Conference – Johnny Baker reported that there is a new Color Guard SOP, not the same as the Honor Guard SOP, read it. When you represent the Color Guard you represent the Marine Corps, much less the Marine Corps League. Currently the Honor Guard SOP is being re-written. Another item talked about was the VSO program, the Marine Corps League was formed to serve Marines, and we have gotten away from that. Bob Borka (National Executive Director) has taken it upon himself to bring back the VSO program. There is a National VSO, Division VSO, and now a Department VSO in Georgia.

Rex Delk spoke about the Southeast Division Conference. He reported that they had so much food there, it was great. Hospitality was awesome and everyone had a great time.

Next year 2026 SE Division Conference will be in Savannah, GA. We will need your help.

Ronnie Brussard has been elected to the Division Vice Commandant, replacing Jerry Holt.

Jim Stone was elected to the Assist Division Vice Commandant. Diana Grantham, the SE Division Newsletter Editor is stepping down and they are looking for a new Editor. Rex asked if Brent Barrett would be interested in helping with the Division Newsletter.

Jim Stone was the recent of the Division Marine of the Year.

Rex brought a point that only 194 applicants applied for the Marine Corps League Scholarship. Of those 191 were approved. The other three did not have a GPA above 3.3.

A new Ritual Manual will be out soon; it's in the Commandant's hands, heading to the Board of Trustees.

Russ Miller gave a presentation on access to the National Library. He explained how to access the library and the password to use.
